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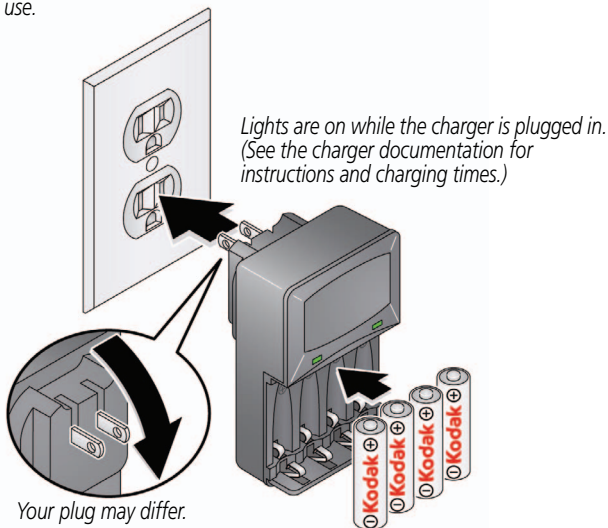
## Getting started with your camera

### IMPORTANT! If your package includes:

- Ni-MH batteries and a charger, continue to [Charging the Ni-MH rechargeable batteries](#).
- Alkaline batteries and no charger, skip to [Loading the batteries](#), page 3. (You may purchase rechargeable AA batteries and a charger at [www.kodak.com/go/accessories](http://www.kodak.com/go/accessories).)

### Charging the Ni-MH rechargeable batteries

All batteries lose power over time—even if they're not being used. For longer life, fully charge KODAK Ni-MH Rechargeable Batteries AA prior to use.



## Loading the batteries

*Press the door lock while sliding the door open.*



*NOTE: You may also use a 5V, 1.5 A AC adapter to power the camera via its USB port.*

## Using an accessory SD/SDHC Card

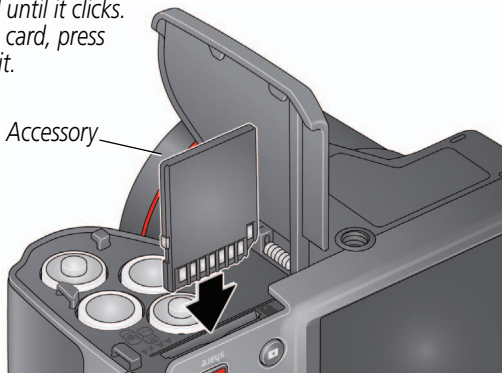
Your camera has internal memory. We recommend purchasing an SD or SDHC Card (Class 4 or higher) to store more pictures/videos. **You must use a Class 4 or higher card to record HD video.**



### CAUTION:

**A card can only be inserted one way; forcing it may cause damage. Inserting or removing a card while the camera is on may damage the pictures, the card, or the camera.**

*Insert a card until it clicks.  
To remove a card, press  
and release it.*



**IMPORTANT:** *When you turn on the camera, it checks to see if a card is inserted. If so, new pictures/videos are stored on the card. If no card is inserted, new pictures/videos are stored in the camera's internal memory.*

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## Setting the language, date/time



### *Language:*

▲▼ to change.

**OK** to accept.

### *Date/Time:*

At the prompt, press **OK**.

◀▶ to change.

▲▼ for previous/next field.

**OK** to accept.

### *Sharing Destinations:*

You can tell the camera which sharing sites to offer when it's time to share pictures/videos.

▲▼ to highlight a site.

**OK** to check/uncheck the site.

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## Taking pictures in Smart Capture mode

- 1 Turn the Mode dial to Smart Capture .
- 2 Use the LCD to compose the picture.




- 3 Press the Shutter button **halfway** to focus and set exposure. Green framing marks indicate successful focus. If the camera is not focusing on the desired subject, or if red brackets or "AF" appear, release the Shutter button and recompose the scene.
- 4 Press the Shutter button **completely down**. The new picture is briefly displayed. If you don't like it, press the Delete button, then follow the prompts.

## Taking videos

**IMPORTANT:** You must use a Class 4 or higher card to record HD video.



- 1 Turn the Mode dial to Video .
- 2 To start recording, press and release the Shutter button. To stop recording, press and release the button again.

*The first frame of the new video and the play button are displayed for a few seconds.*

- To play/pause the video, press the OK button.
- If you don't like the video, press the Delete button, then follow the prompts.





## How long can I record video?

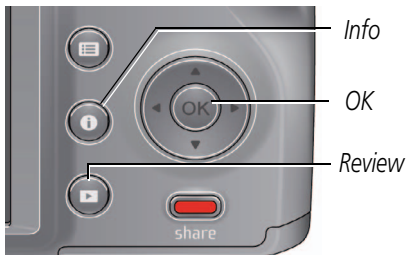
Video Size setting	Approximate file size/video length (depending on scene content)
HD720p	< 2 GB file size / 8–10 minutes
VGA	< 2 GB file size / 20–25 minutes

To switch from HD720p (higher quality, larger file size) to VGA, press the Menu button, highlight Video Size, and press OK.








## Other picture-taking features

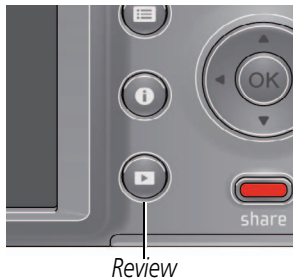
- To view available tools, press the Info button . Press   to choose a tool, then press OK.
- To review, tag, and edit pictures and videos, press the Review button  (see page 10).
- To change camera settings, press the Menu button.
- If it's hard to see the LCD, you can adjust the brightness. (Press the Menu button and choose LCD Brightness.)

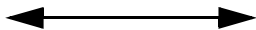
- 1 Press the Review  button.
- 2 Press  for previous/next picture/video.
  - To exit, press the Review button or press the Shutter button halfway down.
  - To view pictures/videos as thumbnails, press the Wide Angle (W) button.

## Playing a video

Press OK to play a video. Press OK to pause/resume. During playback:

- Press  to adjust the volume.
- Press  to play at 2X speed; press again for 4X.
- Press  to reverse at 2X speed; press again for 4X.

## Install software, transfer pictures, and share

**IMPORTANT:** To use the sharing and social networking features, you must install the KODAK Share Button App.

1 Make sure the computer is connected to the Internet.



2 Turn **off** the camera.

3 Using the KODAK Camera USB Cable, Micro B / 5-Pin, connect the camera to the computer. (Use only the cable included with this camera.)

4 Turn **on** the camera.

*The camera works with your computer to download and install the Share Button App on your computer.*

**IMPORTANT:** If the installer does not run, choose and install the right version for your computer: [www.kodak.com/go/camerasw](http://www.kodak.com/go/camerasw).

5 After the software is installed, follow the prompts to transfer pictures and videos to your computer.

*Pictures/videos that you tagged for sharing are emailed or uploaded to the desired social networking sites.*

**NOTE:** You can also use a card reader to transfer pictures/videos to your computer.

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## It's never been easier to share

- 1 Press the Share button, then ◀▶ to find a picture.

*If it's your first time, a Help screen appears.*

- 2 Press ▲▼ to choose a social networking site, then press OK.

*A check mark appears. Repeat this step to choose more sites. (You can press OK again to remove a check mark.)*

- 3 Press ▲▼ to choose Done, then press OK.

*The picture is displayed with the Share icon. When you transfer the picture to your computer, it is uploaded to the networking site(s) that you chose.*

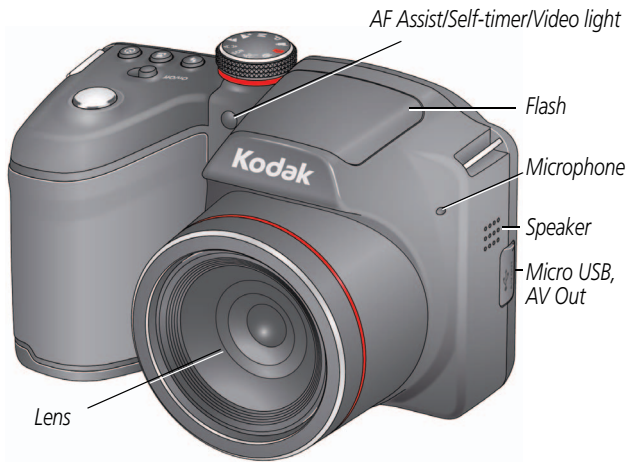

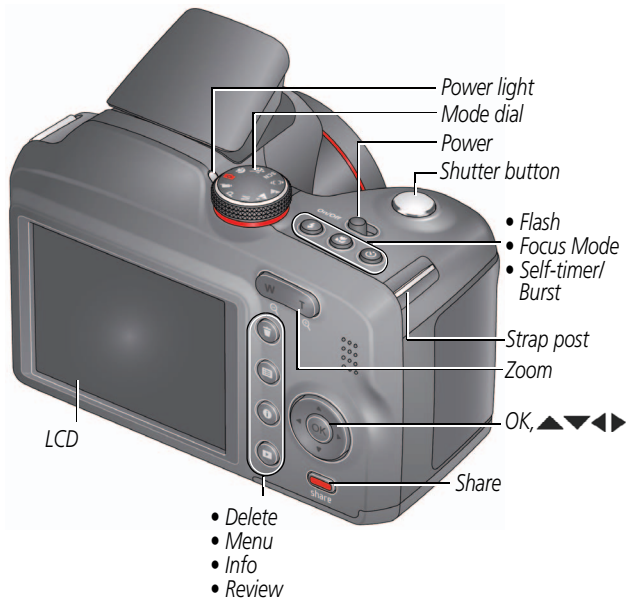

## Doing more with your camera

### Using the flash

Use the flash when you take pictures at night, indoors, or outdoors in heavy shadows. Flash settings are limited in some capture modes.



*Press the Flash button repeatedly to scroll through flash modes. The current flash mode appears on the LCD.*








Flash modes		The flash fires
Auto		When the lighting conditions require it.
Fill		Every time you take a picture, regardless of the lighting conditions. Use when the subject is in shadow or is "backlit" (when the light is behind the subject). In low light, hold the camera steady or use a tripod. NOTE: Not available in Smart Capture mode.
Red-eye Reduction		A preflash fires, shrinking the eye pupil, before the picture is taken.
Off		Never.



## Using different modes

 <b>Smart Capture</b>	Excellent image quality and ease of use.
 <b>Video</b>	Videos with sound.
<b>P</b> <b>M</b> <b>Program Manual</b>	More control over your camera and pictures. (See <a href="#">page 19.</a> )
 <b>Night Landscape</b>	Distant scenery at night. Flash does not fire.
 <b>Landscape</b>	Distant scenes.
 <b>Panorama R-L, L-R</b>	"Stitching" 2 or 3 pictures into 1 panoramic scene.
<b>SCN</b> <b>Scene</b>	Taking pictures in unique environments with point-and-shoot simplicity. (See <a href="#">page 18.</a> )
 <b>Sport</b>	Subjects that are in motion.
 <b>Portrait</b>	Full-frame portraits of people.

## Using SCN (Scene) modes

- 1 Turn the Mode dial to SCN (Scene).
- 2 Press ◀▶ and ▲▼ to read Scene mode descriptions.
- 3 Press OK to choose the Scene mode that you've highlighted.

SCN mode	For
<b>Flower</b>	Close range. Use available light instead of flash, if possible.
<b>Sunset</b>	Subjects at dusk.
<b>Backlight</b>	Subjects that are in shadow or "backlit."
<b>Candle Light</b>	Subjects illuminated by candle light.
<b>Children</b>	Action pictures of children in bright light.
<b>Bright</b>	Bright beach or snow scenes.
<b>Fireworks</b>	Fireworks. For best results, place the camera on a steady surface or tripod.
<b>Self-Portrait</b>	Close-ups of yourself. Assures proper focus and minimizes red eye.
<b>Night Portrait</b>	Reduces red eye of people in night scenes or low-light conditions.
<b>Stage</b>	People on a lit stage. Fast shutter speed, high ISO. Flash and sounds are off.
<b>High ISO</b>	People indoors, in low-light scenes.

## Using Program and Manual modes

Use these modes when you want more control over your camera.

Mode	When to use	Press ◀▶ ▲▼ to control
<b>P</b>	<b>Program</b> mode offers the ease of auto shooting with full access to all menu options. The camera automatically sets the shutter speed and aperture (f-stop) based on the scene lighting.	Exposure compensation (how much light enters the camera), flash compensation, and ISO speed
<b>M</b>	<b>Manual</b> mode offers a high level of control. (To prevent blur, use a tripod for slow shutter speeds.)	Aperture, shutter speed, flash compensation, and ISO speed

**NOTE:** Settings you change in P or M modes apply only to pictures taken in those modes. The settings, including Flash, are maintained for P and M modes—even when you change modes or turn off the camera. Use Reset Camera (press the Menu button) to reset P or M modes to their default settings.

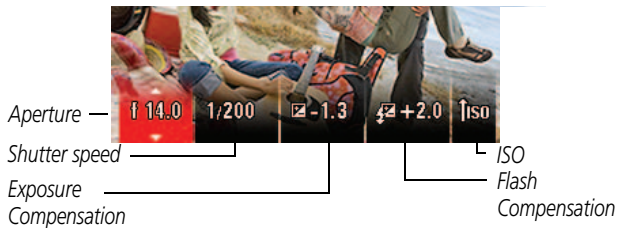
### Changing P or M mode settings

**1** Turn the Mode dial to P or M.

**NOTE:** P and M give access to different settings.

**2** Press the Info button **i**.

- 3 Press ◀▶ to choose a setting, then press OK to edit the setting.  
Press ◀▶ to change a setting, then press OK to save it.



**ISO**—adjust the camera’s sensitivity to light. Higher ISO indicates greater sensitivity.

NOTE: A higher ISO may produce unwanted “noise” in a picture.

**Flash Compensation**—adjust flash brightness.

**Exposure Compensation**—adjust the exposure. If the scene is too light, decrease the setting; if it’s too dark, increase the setting.


**Shutter speed**—control how long the shutter stays open. (Use a tripod for slow shutter speeds.)

**Aperture**—(also known as f-stop) control the size of the lens opening, which determines the depth of field.

- Smaller aperture numbers indicate a larger lens opening; good for low-light.
- Larger aperture numbers indicate a smaller lens opening; keeps the main subject sharp; good for landscapes and well-lit conditions.



## Using the Focus feature



Press the Focus button  repeatedly to scroll through focus modes. The current focus mode appears on the LCD.

**IMPORTANT:** Focus mode availability varies by picture-taking mode.

- 1 Press the Focus button until the desired focus icon is displayed on the LCD.

Mode	Icon	For
<b>Normal AF</b>	No icon	Normal picture taking.
<b>Infinity AF</b>		Distant scenery or for taking pictures through a window. (Turn off the flash when taking pictures through glass.)
<b>Macro AF</b>		Subjects that are 0.1–1 m (0.3–3.3 ft) from the lens.

- 2 Press the Shutter button **halfway** to focus and set exposure, then **completely down** to take the picture.

**IMPORTANT:** If red focus brackets or “AF” appear, adjust the distance to your subject or the amount of zoom.

## Turning on the Date Stamp feature

You can add a stamp—showing the date taken—to **pictures you take next**.

**IMPORTANT:** *You cannot add a date stamp to pictures already taken. Once a date stamp is applied, it cannot be removed on the camera.*

- 1 Press the Menu button.
- 2 Press ▲▼ to choose the Date Stamp, then press OK.
- 3 Follow the prompts to turn on the Date Stamp feature.

*The date is added to pictures you take next. The feature stays on until you turn it off.*

To return to picture-taking mode, press the Shutter button halfway down.
